

3-D Layered Leatherphant

The Leatherphant is an example of multi-layered 3-D composition, taught by Serge Volken and Ralf Meisel in tandem. Serge starts with a bit of design theory: Dividing a picture into separate layers and planning a composition; discussion and demonstration of different 3-D techniques relating to the plasticity of leather (leather fillers, plugs, modeling, and casting). Ready-made fillers will be provided. Then, it's time for handson: Shaping, modeling and texturing leather, skiving, and constructing the layered elements. Complete the project in less time than you'd ever have thought. Ralf will guide you through the coloring, demonstrating techniques of monochrome shading and other hints he has up his sleeve. Each participant should be impressed with their own work at the end of the day. That is how we measure the success of the class and so far, it has always worked!

Materials to Bring: Paper, pencil, tracing paper, bone folder, scratch awl, tracing and modeling tools, some bevelers and pear shaders, mallet, small carving stone, sharp knife or click blade box cutter, skiving blades, and a picture frame (minimum 13 x 18cm, preferably wood).

As a graphic designer, Dave has been using Adobe Illustrator for the last 30 years, using it to create simple line drawings and all the way up to branding and marketing campaigns. Now he uses the application to create carving layouts, project templates, maker stamps, logo designs, marketing material, and so much more...

Materials to Bring: Note taking materials (notebook, pencil/pen, laptop, tablet, mobile phone, etc.). Video recording during the class is not permitted.



Be Creative! Sneakers for Everyone!

Be Creative! Sneakers for Everyone! Be creative and make sneakers in one day! Choose between children's/baby sneakers (size 22) or an adult size 36-47. (Email Simone with your size when you register: moe@moesdesign. de) No matter which size you choose, Simone will explain both versions so that you can later make other sizes yourself at home. These shoes are a single-layer design (see photos) made of leather and/or cowhide, and you can choose your desired color from a selection of threads. You will learn the individual steps such as choosing the material, determining the size, cutting, making holes, making eyelets, and sewing on the sole. You will receive: soles for one pair of shoes, materials you need to make your sneakers, and a needle for sewing.

Materials to Bring: You will need a good mood, sharp scissors and cutter, pen and notepad, a hole punch/rotary punch if you have them (Simone will have a few), and, if the sneakers are for you to wear, bring socks that you wear in the sneakers to determine the right size needed.

Dyeing for Lighting Effects: Stained Glass Window

Dive into the world of colors! In this class, you will get creative and work with different textures, dyes, finishes and colors. Lea will teach you her shading and blending technique with dye and acrylic paint, using different ways to apply color to your leather. Antique techniques and finishes will also be part of our class, as well as light and color theory. In the end, you will not only tool and dye your own "stained glass window" on leather, you will also take home the skills to create stunning light effects on all of your future artworks.

Embossing the Tiger

The tiger has always been an awe-inspiring subject for Kathy. The chosen image for this class brings the power through to the leather. Many techniques are used to create this tiger picture: embossing, scalpel work, fine detail, and fur are all a part of the learning process. These are techniques which can be used over and over in any leather art. Prepare for an intense two days and walk out with your own leather creation. The picture is 11 inches by 14 inches.

Materials to Bring: Tooling surface, mallet, stylus, modeling spoon, swivel knife, bevelers (smooth and checkered), matting tools (smooth and checkered), pear shaders (large, smooth), figure beveler F895, undercut beveler (medium), scalpel with #11 blades, paint brushes (round # 2, 4, 6, and a long liner brush, 5/0), and a pallet knife.

Floral Design with Turquoise Frame

In this course you will learn how to transfer a drawing onto leather, how to work out the details with modeling balls and pear shaders for a better 3-D effect in the stems, leaves, and flowers, how to lift the flowers, and even though the focus of this workshop is carving, Jürgen will show you how to approach coloring the carving – especially the border so that it looks like real turquoise. The leather is calculated in such a way that a beautiful pencil case can be made from it later!

Materials to Bring: Pencil 0.7 B, soft eraser, bone folder, fine tip stylus, swivel knife, strop, mallet, tooling stone, headlamp, steep bevelers of different sizes, different sized pear shaders and thumbprints, center shader, leaf liner, different sizes of lifters, camouflage stamps, small veiners, flower centers, a backgrounder of your choosing, modeling spoons, and modeling ball end tools.

Focus on the Edge Finishing

This unique class will focus on edge finishing, taught by Japanese leather artist and craftsman, Takeshi Yonezawa. The end goal of the one-day class is for students to confidently approach the fine art of edge work for any future project. The class covers a total of seven (7) different types of edge finishing techniques: 1. Un-skived edges; 2. Beveled skived edges; 3. Lap skived edges; 4. Dyed edge burnishing; 5. Edge painting; 6. Folded edges; 7. Folded edge corners. In addition to finishing techniques, students will also learn these foundational, yet critical, steps: 1) edge finishing preparation; 2) glue application; and 3) skiving machine operation basics. Learn directly from Yonezawa the techniques he's curated and tested from his 20+ years of leatherwork.

Materials to Bring: Leather knife, glue spreader, edge paint roller, cutting surface, #400 sandpaper or sanding stick, ruler, notebook and pen, skinny and pointy scratch awls, bone or wood folding tool, knife for skiving, cloth or wood burnishing tool, edger, small glass plate (smooth/flat), and a pencil.

Hand Sewing Level Up!

Learn a variety of different hand stitching techniques and find out new tips and tricks to add to the ones you learned in the past. We'll discuss and try out box and butt joint stitching, the traditional version of the two-needle saddler's stitch, decorative braid stitches and more. On top of that, you will get a lot of information about different awls, thread and needle types, and knots. Learn techniques that will allow you to bring your leathercrafting ideas to life.

Materials to Bring: Notebook, pencil, stitching awl with sword blade, round awl, divider, pricking irons, mallet, cutting board for the pricking irons, and a stitching pony/clamp. There will be stitching ponies/clamps to borrow, but you might prefer your own.

Knife Sheath Holster

This knife sheath looks like a holster, but it is specially designed for a Buck knife (#110). You will learn some Sheridan style tooling as well as a special technique to build up the filler. The filler is designed to hold the knife safely in the sheath without the need for buckles or straps.

Materials to Bring: A 101 or A 104, A 101-3 or A 105, B 203, B 892, B 935, E 386, F 902, P 367 or P 368, S 350 or S 722, U 858, V 404, V 463, V 920 (or, if available: Barry King's Sheridan style tools), mallet, edge creaser no. 4, swivel knife with _" slim angle blade, head knife/utility knife, tracing tool, pro petal, edge beveler no. 3, edge slicker (nylon or wood), stitch groover, needles and thread for hand stitching, Dremel power tool and small drill (if available), strop, wool pieces, waterproof sandpaper (400 grit), glass Coke bottle, cordura cloth, cutting board, contact cement, and a tooling stone.

Create a beautiful, authentic, Red-Tailed Hawk tail feather out of leather! 

Padded Dog Collar

Making fine leather goods with strap leather requires a few additional steps. In this workshop, you'll understand how to elevate your strap goods by making a padded dog collar. First, you'll learn how to accurately measure for the correct length of collar. Then, you'll make the pad from foam and cover it with leather using Steffen's methods. Edge finishing for a smooth and polished look comes next. The buckle, loop, and D-ring will be added and the collar will be hand-sewn using the saddle stitch.

Materials to Bring: Pencil, notebook, needles for saddle stitching, stitching awls, head knife, edge bevelers, cutting board, stitching pony, maul, tape measure, scissors, lamp, and wing dividers.



Precision Stamping with Barry King

Barry King has produced thousands of basket stamps over the years and he's tried every single one of their designs! This workshop will consist of basic to advanced designs using your tools. Barry will begin with design overview of placing brands, initials, or floral designs into the geometric patterns. You'll learn proper usage of tools to create the designs they are meant to create, and then use the same tools to create new designs. Attention will be given to how to orient the tools so that they line up as well as address how to fit your design within an allocated space (borderto-border). There will be open discussion for any questions on finishing projects as well. Barry will have many tools available to try to see what designs you can create with them.

Materials to Bring: Stamping stone, mallet/maul, ruler, square, stylus, geometric tools, wing dividers, note taking materials and a camera.

You will take home a belt blank with a cut tip and skived buckle end and knowledge of how to master this versatile tool.

Sharpen Your Swivel Knives!

The swivel knife: The most important tool for carving leather. Learning to properly sharpen a swivel knife – and keep it sharp – is a process. Learn how to sharpen your swivel knife blades by hand using polishing paste, diamond paste powder, sanding papers, and sole leather. Do you have any specific problems with the swivel knife? Bring your questions to ask Jürgen. He will also show you also how to repair a ceramic blade.

Materials to Bring: Swivel knife, blades to sharpen, notebook, and a pencil.

Sliding Turks Head Knots

Braided knots can be incorporated into projects like bracelets, key rings, bag closures, and as far as your imagination takes you. In this class, you will create sliding knots with some variations. We will start with the basic knot, then move on to integrating two types of interweaves, such as the Herringbone and Pineapple. The main goal is to repeat the Turks head knot several times, because repetition makes us memorize the steps better.

Materials to Bring: Lacing fid/awl, bone folder, thread needles, lacing needles, some brushes, and rags to apply finish and antique. A small desk lamp or headlamp will be helpful, too.

Swivel Knife Finesse

Wield your swivel knife with confidence! Learning to cut smoothly and seamlessly is the goal of this workshop. This is the right workshop for anyone who is a little afraid of making decorative cuts, or who has some trouble with positioning or holding the swivel knife, has problems with sharpening, does not know which blade is to be used for what...Let Jürgen guide you on cutting depth, pressure, correct hand grip, cutting for beveling, cutting for decorative cuts, using the correct blade for your work, and more. He'll also be teaching correct sharpening techniques and ways to keep your blades sharper for longer. Patterns that will challenge and delight will be provided. Vests 101: Fitting

This class will teach the fundamentals of garment fitting that will then be used to create a cotton canvas shell for a vest that fits. We'll talk about how to take accurate measurements, modify a pattern, construct the garment, and fine tune the fit. You'll come away with an understanding of how to make a vest that *finally fits* and a pattern that you can use for any fabric or leather. Basic machine sewing skills are helpful.

During her apprenticeship, she met other young saddlemakers and was introduced to leather carving. This started her passion for any kind of artistic leatherwork.

is 42 years old and lives in southern Germany. Her job as a mechanical engineering technician meant she has always liked working with her hands. She started trying out with leather 9 years ago. For a few years, she made custom leather handbags full-time, which she shipped all over the world. Moe now has an online shop for people who like leatherwork and she goes to different markets to sell her products.



Gerda van der Stroom

began to work with leather in 1982, with her main interest being to make useful and functional leather art. She does a lot of custom work such as designing wall decorations, saddlebags, saddles, cases, belts, jewelry and more.
