





Precious containers for precious contents, be it for an engagement ring, a coin collection or your favoured swivel knife. The art of making leather boxes has been around for centuries. I had the chance to see originals from close, study them and learn a few tricks. Using ancient knowledge combined with new means of making I propose to lead you step by step into the architecture of building a 100% leather box without any stitching. We also discuss different options. Examples of 15th Century cases will be shown for close examination. After this class you will not only bring back home an original mini leather casket, but also the keys to a wide range of new project ideas based on the principles acquired during this class. Attention, basic skiving skills are required. This workshop can be taught in French, German, English, Italian and Spanish.

Materials to Bring: Skiving blade, small box cutter, a few stamping tools of your choice, a wing divider, bone folder, cutting board, small water spray bottle, and Band-aids.

Have you ever noticed the hair on a bison? Look closely and you will see that the length varies from satiny and short to wild and shaggy, going every which direction. This workshop is designed to explain the differences in the construction of the hair, in every length. Learn also how to create depth in the hair, to make the fluffy parts stand out without changing the depth of the leather itself. A clear finish will be applied at the end so that you can go home with a completed 5" x 7" (12.7cm x 17.75cm) picture, ready to frame. This workshop will be taught in English.

Materials to Bring: Stamping stone, mallet, stylus, modeling spoon, swivel knife, a weight to hold down the leather while you work, and bevelers and pear shaders in various sizes (smooth and checkered).





Looking to fill in a space that you don't have the right basket stamp for? Don't have a pattern to trace that fits? Not interested in using a floral design? Creating our own basket weaving designs that can be carved with less than half a dozen tools, mallet included. We'll be learning a design concept opening an endless supply of possibilities and options with mind boggling effects. We will talk about "design thinking", leading us much further along and beyond just making a pretty drawing. It is all about easy-to-remember grids and formulas, no need to be good at drawing. If you can hold a pencil and count to three you're in. The result? Some never-before-seen basket weaving designs with a hypnotic effect on the viewer – though they are as easy to create as a smile. This workshop can be taught in French, German, English, Italian and Spanish.

Materials to Bring: Hard pencil (H or HB), soft pencil (3B or softer), colored pencils (at least 4 colors), ruler, minimalist carving set (swivel knife, beveler, modelling tool, mallet), and a stamping stone.

So, from learning to draw directly onto the leather – skipping the pattern transfer step – to the finished project, follow Yves on the path to a unique approach for floral drawing/carving. Learn how to get flow, harmony, and balance in your projects using his personal multi-primary circles method. There will be plenty of time for questions. A perfect follow-up workshop is Yves' Intermediate Floral Drawing (for those with some experience). This workshop can be taught in both French and English simultaneously.

Participants will learn how to string and design a standard pattern (half diamonds and bars) on a 17-stand straight single layer western mohair cinch (up to 32"/81 cm) or 15-stand straight single layer English mohair girth (up to 80 cm). Participants will be able to choose the colors for their cinch from available colors (please contact Aurelie prior the workshop to select your colors). Learn how to estimate the length of mohair needed for any straight tied mohair cinch in regards to finished length and/or the number of strands. Some specific patterns, like a "checkerboard", will also be shown. Special attention will be given to addressing the importance of the technical aspects and their impacts on the horse and fitting a cinch (length/width) and how those measurements impact the horse. There will be a review of the different kinds of hardware available on the market as well.

All supplies (mohair and hardware) and tools (frame, scissors, needle) are provided by EQUIMOHAIR and participants will leave with their own cinch. If the students are done with their cinch before the end of the 2 days, further subjects will be discussed (bi-colors, ropers or whatever specific subject students want to see). If there is enough time, students can make a second cinch/girth, paying an extra fee for the additional materials. After this workshop, students will be "autonomous" on the building of a tied cinch and will be able to make mohair tack for their own need or for business. Mohair is hypoallergenic, comfortable, and breathable (healthy for the horse). It is really strong and easy to care of. This workshop is provided in English and/or French.

Materials to Bring: Pencil, notepad, camera, and a floor cushion (some prefer to work sitting on a chair, others on the floor).

You will learn how to estimate the length of mohair needed for a woven roper mohair cinch in regards to the finished length and/or the number of strands. All supplies (mohair and hardware) and tools (frame, scissors, needle, spacers etc...) are provided by EQUIMOHAIR and participants will leave with their own cinch. Upon completion of this workshop, the student will be "autonomous" on the building of a woven cinch and will be able to make mohair tack for their own need or for business. Mohair is hypoallergenic, comfortable, and breathable for the horse. It is really strong and easy to care of. This workshop is provided in English and/or French.

Materials to Bring: Pencil, notepad, camera, and a floor cushion (some prefer to work sitting on a chair, others on the floor).





Have you ever looked at your backgrounding and wondered why it is so choppy-looking, as though you can see where each tool's impression starts and stops? This kind of background work distracts the eye from the rest of the carving/stamping! 



In this workshop, you will learn how to make a tailor-made belt with a floral tooling motif. This belt is cut to a width of 40mm, lined and sewn on a machine. Learn to apply color in typical brown tones and finish with Fiebing's Tan-Kote and an antique paste! Some coloring with oil dye will also be available. The buckle will be attached using snaps or bookbinding screws (your choice). This workshop will be taught in English and German.

He began making western saddles after attending Fred Harsant's school. He is now a full-time western saddle maker and teacher. Yves is a founding member and a former president of the European Cowboy Gear Maker and Artist Association. He regularly teaches leatherworking and carving classes at his workshop in Villeveyrac, France. Yves speaks French and English.



Isaac Romero

Isaac Romero has been a full-time leather worker based in Pontevedra, Spain, since 2003, though he started leatherworking at 14 years of age (he's now 42).
