What is the World Leather Debut?

The *World Leather Debut* is a special event for leather workers/artists worldwide held during the Rocky Mountain Leather Trade Show. Makers of any skill level are invited to enter their work to compete for cash prizes and awards in one or more of seventeen categories (two of which are designated for youth) and/or to receive their score sheets from the judges. A select duo of judges in each category determine 1st, 2nd and 3rd placement and provide written constructive feedback on the sore sheets. The entries are arranged in a gallery setting for the public to tour over a three day span during the Rocky Mountain Leather Trade Show. The Debut is an enjoyable event that can challenge and even enhance one's perspective, skills and self confidence, whether it be the contestant or the public.

1) General Rules

Rules and Regulations

A. Entries must be suitable for display in a gallery setting for all ages to view. For example, items can be disqualified for vulgarity, profanity and sexually explicit content. All questionable entries are subject to approval by an independent, undisclosed panel of artists. If concerned, submit photos of your entry for prior review by the artist panel.



- B. The Leather Crafter's Journal will use all reasonable care in the handling of entries but will assume no liability for loss or damage. Contestants hereby release the Leather Crafter's Journal (including all staff and volunteers) and the Sheridan College (including its staff, volunteers and directors) from any responsibility, personal liability or claims for loss or damage arising from contestant's participation in the 2024 World Leather Debut.
- C. Photographs of entries, information about the contestants and other such materials may be used by the *Leather Crafter's Journal* in promotional and merchandising materials.
- D. Each entry must be made by one individual and registered under that maker's name. Prizes, awards and announcements will be awarded only to the individual who made the item.
- E. All entries must have been completed after January 1, <u>2023</u> and never entered in a previous World Leather Debut.
- F. Each entry must consist of 70% or more leather. Frames, foundations, and hardware excluded.
- **G.** Metal decorations, hardware and poppers (braiding) that are part of the entry do not have to be made by the maker/contestant. (e. g. silverwork, conchos, horn caps, poppers, etc.)
- H. Each entry must bear the name of the maker (maker stamp or tag) for identification purposes. Attach tags to an inconspicuous location.
- I. Entries are to remain on display until 11:00 a.m. Sunday, May 19, 2024.
- J. Refund Policy A full refund of all paid fees will be issued for cancellations received by the *Journal* on or before May 1, 2024. Return shipping, repacking and stand rental fees only will be refunded after this date, provided no items are to be return shipped at the time of cancellation.
- K. Stand Rental Saddle and chap stands are available to rent for display of your entry(s). Rental fee is \$5.00 per stand. Quantities are limited - Firstcome, first-served basis.
- L. Definitions specific to each category are detailed in the "Categories" section on pages 10-12 and apply to all items entered in the World Leather Debut.

2) Entry and Registration

- A. Main Categories 1-15 Enter as many items/categories as you wish.
- B. Main Categories 1-15 An entry fee is required for each artwork entered. For those entries registered by April 10, 2024, an entry fee of \$30.00 per entry applies. For those entries registered between April 11, 2024 and May 1, 2024, an entry fee of \$45.00 per entry applies. Example: One entry equals \$30.00/\$45.00, two entries equal \$60.00/\$90.00, etc.
- C. Youth Category \$10.00 entry fee per item. Limit one item per Youth contestant. Parent or guardian of youth must sign the registration form.



- D. Registration form(s) and all fees/funds must be received (digital or paper) at the office of the Leather Crafter's Journal (PO Box 673, Rhinelander, WI 54501 USA) by the final registration deadline of midnight, CST, Wednesday, May 1, 2024 to be eligible to enter the Debut. Registrations received after this date and time cannot be allowed to compete in the Debut. Register online, by mail or by phone. If registering early, all forms and fees must arrive at the office of the Journal by midnight, CST, Wednesday, April 10, 2024.
- E. Payment of entry fees evidences contestant's agreement to all Rules and Regulations of the World Leather Debut.

3) Judging

- A. Judging will be performed by two judges per category (barring illness).
- B. Judging will take place Thursday evening and Friday morning, May 16-17, 2024.
- C. All entries will be judged for determination of First, Second and Third placement in each category.
- **D.** Ribbons will be placed on winning entries as judging and scoring for each category is completed.
- E. Judges and the Leather Crafter's Journal reserve the right to:
 - Move an entry into a more appropriate category.
 - Make exceptions for minor variances.
 - Disqualify an entry, all without contestant approval.
- F. Decisions of the judges and Leather Crafter's Journal are final.

4) Prize Money and Awards

- A. Main Categories 1 through 15:
 - 1st Place Cash Prize \$550.00, Blue Ribbon & Award Certificate (\$800.00 for each Saddle category)
 - 2nd Place Cash Prize \$250.00, Red Ribbon & Award Certificate
 - 3rd Place Cash Prize \$100.00, White Ribbon & Award Certificate
- B. Youth Category Junior Division #16:
 - 1st Place Cash Prize \$75.00, Blue Ribbon & Award Certificate
 - 2nd Place Cash Prize \$50.00, Red Ribbon & Award Certificate
 - 3rd Place Cash Prize \$25.00, White Ribbon & Award Certificate
- C. Youth Category Senior Division #17:
 - 1st Place Cash Prize \$100.00, Blue Ribbon & Award Certificate
 - 2nd Place Cash Prize \$75.00, Red Ribbon & Award Certificate
 - 3rd Place Cash Prize \$50.00, White Ribbon & Award Certificate
- **D.** Payment of Cash Prizes will be distributed within three weeks after the show. Cash prizes paid to artists in the USA will be paid by check. International payments must be made to a Paypal account.



5) Arrival and Shipping

- A. Hand-delivered entries will be accepted and checked-in at the Sheridan College - Thorne-Rider Campus Center between 12:00 p.m. and 5:30 p.m. MST on Thursday May 16, 2024.

- C. Exceptions to 4A. and 4B. are possible and must be preapproved by the Leather Crafter's Journal.
- D. To ensure safe arrival of your entry, use new and sturdy shipping containers.

6) Departure and Return Shipping

- A. Picking Up Entry If picking up your entry, please do so between 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. on Sunday, May 19, 2024. Entries not picked up by 2:00 p.m. on the 19th are subject to a \$20.00 handling fee in addition to repacking and return shipping fees.
- Return Shipping Method The following methods of shipping are available to have your item return shipped to you: UPS-Air, UPS-Ground, Fed Ex-Ground, US Postal Service - Priority Mail.
- C. Return Shipping Container To aid in the safe return of entries to be return shipped, please carry out the following:
 - Include return shipping Name and Address informatino with entries.
 - "Invest in the box". Use new and extra sturdy shipping containers. Entries will be returned in the same containers they were received in.
 - · Use adequate packing material inside of container to protect your artwork during shipping. This same material (type and amount) will be used to return ship your item to you. Please NO Packing Peanuts.
 - Items that arrive damaged and/or poorly packaged may be returned unopened!
- D. Return Shipping Costs If your entry(s) is to be shipped back to you, payment of return shipping funds must be prearranged by one of the following:
 - · Include a prepaid return shipping label with entry.
 - · Provide charge/debit card information to process return shipping funds after the Debut.
 - Prepay return shipping funds at time of registration. (Shipping fees vary based on their origin of shipment. Prepaid return shipping funds are



to be 50% more than the estimated original shipping cost to Sheridan to ensure adequate return shipping fees. Excess return shipping funds will be returned to the contestant after the Debut.)

- Entries without adequate return shipping funds will not be return shipped until adequate return shipping funds are received by the *Journal* and an additional handling fee of \$15.00 per entry is paid.
- E. Return Shipping Repacking Fee If your entry(s) is to be shipped back to you, a re-packing fee of \$10.00 **per shipping container** (not per entry) applies and must accompany your registration.
- F. Return Shipping of artwork is a process that requires care and attention to details. It is oftentimes very involved and time consuming to ensure that the artist's artwork is returned properly and to the correct address, particularly for artwork that is shipped outside of the USA. Return shipping of artwork may take up to four weeks before it is shipped, all dependant upon communication and verification with the artist and the overall number of artworks to be shipped.

7) Makers Directory

- **A.** The Makers Directory is a pamphlet that lists each contestant's name by category to help promote the Maker. There is <u>no cost</u> to the contestant for this listing. The Makers Directory is <u>free</u> for the public to take at will at the World Leather Debut.
- **B.** Contestant can choose to have their contact information (e.g. company name, address, telephone, e-mail and website) listed in the Makers Directory. This is *optional* and there is *no additional cost* to the contestant to have this information listed. Contestant *must check* the related box in Section 3 of the Registration Form to have their contact information listed.
- C. The Makers Directory is the property of the *Leather Crafter's Journal*. Reproduction of the Makers Directory is prohibited. The *Leather Crafter's Journal* reserves the right to reproduce and market the Makers Directory at will.

8) About My Work

- **A.** About My Work is an optional write-up that contestants can display with their entry regarding any aspect(s) of their artwork that they want the judges or public to know. For example, your entry might have a particular aspect in design or construction that you want to explain to avoid any misunderstanding on the judge's part. Or perhaps you would like to share a particular challenge(s) you faced in creating your entry and how you overcame it.
- **B.** The write-up needs to display the contestants name at the top of the page, needs to be typed on either a 5.50" X 8.00" or 8.50" X 11.00" size paper and enclosed in a clear plastic sleeve or laminated. Include your write-up with your artwork when you deliver it to the Debut.

- Be sure to register by the Final Deadline of Wednesday, May 1, 2024.
- Register Early by April 10, 2024 and SAVE \$15.00 on your entry fee.
- All registration forms and payment MUST be received (digital or paper) by the Leather Crafter's Journal by midnight CST, Wednesday, May 1, 2024 to be eligible to enter the Debut. If registering early, all forms and fees must be received by the Journal by midnight, CST, Wednesday, April 10, 2024. If mailing your registration, be sure to mail early.
- If registering by phone or online, payment of entry fees evidences contestant's agreement to all Rules and Regulations of the World Leather Debut.
- Online Registration: Submit one registration per entry.
- Paper Registration: Submit one registration form per entry. If entering more than one item, record total fees and payment on first registration form.

1. Braided Items - Leather:

Any braided item which consists predominantly of **leather** braid. Specify if you cut, bevelled and split your own string in Section 2 of the Registration Form. Components not braided (e.g. poppers, hobble rings, mecates, etc.) can be made by someone other than the contestant. However all braiding must be done only by the contestant. *Judging Criteria: Design, Construction, String Formation & Uniformity, Finish & Accents, Bonus Points.*

2. Braided Items - Rawhide:

Any braided item which consists predominately of **rawhide** braid. Specify if you made your own rawhide and cut, bevelled and split your own string in Section 2 of the Registration Form. Components not braided (e.g. poppers, hobble rings, mecates, etc.) can be made by someone other than the contestant. However all braiding must be done only by the contestant. *Judging Criteria: Design, Construction, String Formation & Uniformity, Finish & Accents, Bonus Points*.

3. Chaps & Chinks:

All custom made chaps or chinks such as batwing, shotgun, show chaps, chap-bat and reiners, etc. Stands available to rent. See registration form.

Judging Criteria: Design, Construction, Carving/Stamping (If Applicable), Color & Finish & Accents, Bonus Points.

4. Clothing:

Appropriate soft leather garments for all ages - Shirts/tops, vests, jackets/coats, dress/skirt, pants and the like. Also includes hats/caps and gloves/mittens. Judging Criteria: Design & Styling, Construction, Details & Accents, Fit, Bonus Points.

5. Cowboy Boots:

All custom-made leather cowboy boots. A **pair of boots** must be entered. *Judging Criteria: Design, Construction, Symmetry, Finish, Bonus Points.*

6. Holsters - Tooled:

All custom-made, fully or partially tooled holsters or rigs. *Judging Criteria: Design, Construction, Fit & Function, Carving/Stamping, Color & Finish & Accents, Bonus Points.*

7. Holsters - Un-Tooled:

All custom-made holsters or rigs whose surface is not carved/tooled (including swivel knife work) or stamped. Tools used only for molding purposes are allowed. *Judging Criteria: Design, Construction, Fit & Function, Color & Finish & Accents, Bonus Points.*

8. Personal Items - Tooled:

Sheaths, book covers, albums, notebooks, portfolios, cases, canteens, cuffs, belts, or other items worn on or carried by a person **excluding** purses, bags and wallets. The surface of these items are partially or fully tooled – either carved (floral, figure, pictorial, etc.), stamped (basket or geometric) or both. *Judging Criteria: Design, Construction, Carving/Stamping, Color & Finish & Accents, Bonus Points.*

9. Pictures:

Figure carving, pictorial carving, floral carving, embossing, etc. (or combinations of such) that are in "picture" form. Framed or unframed. If frame is made of or covered with leather, it will be judged as part of the picture. Can be designed to hang or stand.

Judging Criteria: Design, Craftsmanship, Finish & Accents, Bonus Points.

10. Purses, Bags & Wallets:

Purses, bags and wallets. The surface of these items are partially or fully tooled – either carved (floral, figure, pictorial, etc.), stamped (basket or geometric) or both. Judging Criteria: Design, Construction, Carving/Stamping, Color & Finish & Accents, Bonus Points.

11. Saddles - Carved:

Saddle is to be partially or fully carved. Seat is to be 13" or larger. Saddles predominantly carved but containing a lesser amount of basket or geometric stamping will be placed in the Saddles-Carved category. Stamping will not add to score but can detract if substandard in quality. Bring a tall stand if your saddle has "taps". Regular size stands available to rent (See registration form). Judging Criteria: Design, Balance/Symmetry, Construction, Functionality, Carving and Finish, Bonus Points.

12. Saddles - Geometric or Basket Stamped:

Saddle is to be partially or fully basket or geometric stamped. Seat is to be 13" or larger. Saddles predominantly stamped but containing a lesser amount of carving will be placed in the Saddles-Geometric or Basket Stamped category. Carving will

not add to score but can detract if substandard in quality. Bring a tall stand if your saddle has "taps". Regular Size stands available to rent. See registration form. Judging Criteria: Design, Balance/Symmetry, Construction, Functionality, Stamping and Finish, Bonus Points.

13. Stand Alone - Tooled:

Objects such as leather sculptures, clocks, boxes, storage cases, mirrors, holders, decorative items, animals and other such things that "stand alone" and don't move or tend to be moved. Items as such designed to hang on a wall are included in this category. The surface of these items are partially or fully tooled – either carved (floral, figure, pictorial, etc.), stamped (basket or geometric) or both.

Judging Criteria: Design, Construction, Carving/Stamping, Color & Finish & Accents, Bonus Points.

14. Tack & Saddle Accouterments:

Any leather riding or driving equipment related to the horse or the saddle (but not part of saddle), (e.g. reins, bridles, headstalls, halters, breast collars, tapaderos, pommel bags, saddle holsters, rifle scabbards, saddlebags, spur straps, etc.) (Braided items not included).

Judging Criteria: Design, Construction, Carving/Stamping (If Applicable), Color & Finish & Accents, Bonus Points.

15. Un-Tooled Items:

Objects that would normally be classified in the *Personal Items*, *Stand Alone* or *Purses*, *Bags & Wallets* categories but whose surface is **not** carved/tooled (including swivel knife work) or stamped. Tools used only for molding purposes are allowed (which includes modeling tools). *Judging Criteria: Design, Construction, Color & Finish & Accents, Bonus Points*.

16. Youth - Junior Division: Ages 8 to 13.

Only items matching description of Categories #1 through #15 are eligible to compete in the Youth category. Age is as of May 16, 2024. Entries in each division will be judged together (e.g. chaps, picture, and purse will compete against each other). All Rules and Regulations of the Debut apply to the Youth Category. **Note:** Youth are also eligible to participate in Main Categories 1 through 15 if interested. *Judging Criteria: Design, Construction, Carving/Stamping (If Applicable), Color & Finish & Accents, Bonus Points.*

17. Youth - Senior Division: Ages 14 to 18. Regulations in Category #16 apply.

Entries must be suitable for display in a gallery setting for all ages to view. For example, items can be disqualified for vulgarity, profanity and sexually explicit content. All questionable entries are subject to approval by an independent, undisclosed panel of artists. If concerned, submit photos of your entry for prior review by the artist panel. Judges reserve the right to disqualify an entry or move an entry to a more appropriate category. Thank you!

Judging (Continued)

Judging of artwork takes place on Thursday evening, May 16, 2024 and Friday morning, May 17, 2024.

Judging of each category is done by two judges (barring unforseen illness). All decisions of the judges are final. Each judge scores each entry based on the criteria reflected in each category description.

Each criterion is scored on the points basis, 1 being the lowest and 10 or 15 (dependent upon the category) the highest. As a judge evaluates an entry, he/she records each criterion's score on the judge's score sheet and then tallies them for that entry's total score. Each judge's score is then combined with their associate judge's score. The combined scores within a category are then compared to determine First, Second and Third placement.

Judges also record their comments on the score sheets regarding the entry and the contestant's work.
